WORSHIP

The Worship Committee had a great deal on its "liturgical plate" in November as we reviewed the special services coming up for Advent and Christmas including the lighting of Advent candles, the children's Christmas pageant, and Christmas Eve and Christmas Day worship.

In order to shorten the length of the Christmas Eve service, we decided that there will be four communion servers – the interim pastor and three elders – to serve the sacrament "by intinction" at the front of the church. Also, since Rev. Sprowl will be on vacation Sunday, January when we'll have a guest preacher, we decided to ask the Session to move the regular communion date from the first Sunday of the month to Sunday, January 15. (The Session sets the day and time for the service of the Lord's Supper.) Last, in order for the 2012 budget to more closely reflect actual expenditures in 2011, we recommended reducing the worship budget by \$200 to \$1,085.

Members of the Worship Committee include chairperson Jerry Bond, Valerie Harsh, Sandra Perkins, Rose Scott and Marquita Simpson. Rev. Sprowl also attends the meetings.



SUNDAYS IN DECEMBER...

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 4 – Second Sunday in Advent – After centuries of prophecy foretelling the event, God still felt the services of John the Baptist were needed to "prepare the way" for Jesus. "Why?" Pastor Mark explores possible reasons the work of J.T.B. in his message, *Crying Out in the Wilderness.* Read Isaiah 40:1-11 and Mark 1:1-8 to prepare.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 11 – *Third Sunday in Advent* – Our children and youth present the story of Christmas in their musical and spoken

presentation, *The Night Before*... You won't want to miss this energetic re-telling of the old story with its angels, innkeeper, wise men, shepherds, lambs and, of course, the holy couple and baby Jesus.

SUNDAY, DECEMBER 18 – Fourth Sunday in Advent – The popular Christmas tune, Mary, Did You Know? asks the haunting question as to how much of his divinity Jesus' mother Mary understood from early on. Mary's "song" which she shared with her cousin Elizabeth called *The* Magnificat suggests, however, that Mary understood quite a bit about her son's mission in the world. Pastor Mark helps us to reappraise Jesus through Mary's eyes in his message, Mary, You DID Know! Read Luke 1:26-56 and Isaiah 7:14 to prepare.

SUNDAY, DECEMBMER 25 – *Christmas Day* - An informal worship service of familiar carols and a brief meditation by Pastor Mark. Worship is at 11:00 am, and there will be no Sunday School that day.

CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP - 6:00 PM

On December 24, Christmas Eve, once again we will tell Luke's old story which today continues to give new life. We will sing the familiar carols and invite you to bring bells to accompany our carols. We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper in small groups at the front of the church and conclude worship by lighting our lights as a sign of Christ's light having entered our world. Children are welcome. (*Note the earlier time for this service!*)
