#### SAINT TO SAINT... GOD'S JOYFUL STEWARDS

**Oh boy, a church committee!** In my mid-20's, I became a member of a Presbyterian church for the first time, and guess what!? My church did what every faithful church does for newcomers... they invited me to become a member of a committee! But not the Worship Committee or CE or Facilities or Fellowship. Those groups seemed to be full up... BUT there were plenty of openings on the Stewardship Committee!

I thought I knew something about it... And, at the time, Stewardship was something that I thought I knew a lot about! After all, I had participated in my company's United Way campaign and saw the red column on the poster board thermometer inch its way up toward the desired goal. I remembered selling "The World's Finest Chocolate Bar" as a high school fundraiser. I'd heard the poignant stories of the missionaries in worship explaining how many lives could be changed for just an additional \$15 a month. I thought I was prepared to be a faithful steward.

**Beginning to define stewardship...** When the pastor asked members of the committee what we thought stewardship meant, I explained that it was "raising money for the church." Some others agreed. The pastor, however, suggested that the kind of stewardship the Bible talked about didn't have to do with raising money... but rather with raising awareness, awareness of what the Lord was doing in our lives and in the world... and how we choose to respond to what the Lord has done.

**Discovering biblical examples...** The pastor led us in a study of Genesis (1:28-30) and the Psalms (24:1) pointing out how God has called human beings to be caretakers or stewards of the created world. In response to what God was doing in their lives, faithful stewards in the Old Testament gave a tenth of the firstfruits of their crops and animals (Genesis 14:20, 28:22). In the New Testament, the pastor suggested, Jesus and Paul had raised the ante... asking us to become "living sacrifices" (Romans 12:1) for the Lord!

**Paul and Jesus...** I was introduced to the writings of Paul in 2 Corinthians where he says that giving is not a matter of grudging obedience but rather an act of joy (2 Corinthians 9:7)... and that the Lord doesn't ask us to give beyond our means but rather what we are able (2 Corinthians 8:12). And while it's natural to worry about money and finances, Jesus taught that if we focus on living according to the principles of God's Kingdom, our needs will be met (Matthew 6:33).

The preacher ought to practice what he preaches... I now count it as a blessing my first committee assignment was stewardship and that some of my misconceptions about stewardship were set right at the beginning of my faith journey. And yet as both a minister and a Christian, I've discovered that simply coming to an understanding of what one is called to do is very different from the actual doing of it! Like everyone who lives in a culture that places such a high value upon money and the things it buys, I wrestle daily with what it means to be a faithful

steward of all that the Lord has placed under my care, but I'm thankful that some of the guilt-inducing ought's and should's have been replaced by a sense of freeing choice and of being in a unique position to bless those around me including the church I serve.

**Truly Good News...** I've heard some of my minister friends complain how it can be difficult for them to preach about stewardship, because they sense that their congregations see it as "asking for a raise." I've happily never had that reservation, because I've discovered that biblical stewardship is neither about a particular church nor its pastor but rather about freedom of choice, sharing of blessings, and partnering with others to create a more just world. As both a disciple of Jesus and a preacher, to me, that's Good News!


# CLERK'S CORNER NOVEMBER 2011

#### WORSHIP IN NOVEMBER

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 6 – **HOLY COMMUNION** - The dollar sign, the Boy Scout emblem, the Golden arches, the American Flag... all signs of our world that touch our minds, our hearts and perhaps even our stomachs (!) As we embrace any given sign and what it stands for, it says something about who we are as people and as disciples of Jesus. From passages Exodus 24:3-8 and Matthew 26:26-30, Pastor Mark also discovers another *Sign of the Times* that may make all the difference! We will also celebrate the Lord's Supper.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 13 – **VISITORS SUNDAY** – Fashion and health magazines regularly give us examples of what our culture considers beautiful, but surprise, the Bible has a different take about "beauty," and it has nothing to do with looks. Find out what turns God's eye in Pastor Mark's message *Body Beautiful*. Read 1 Corinthians 12 to prepare. A luncheon celebrating our visitors will follow worship.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 20 – **DEDICATION SUNDAY** – We've often heard about the importance of nurturing, "an attitude of gratitude," but how do we actually do it? On this Sunday where we sing the familiar hymns of the Thanksgiving holiday, Pastor Mark suggests an answer to this ageold question in his message, *Thanksgiving into Thanks-Living!* Sermon text will be in the November 13 bulletin.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 27 – **FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT** – If you want to win a race, a lot of preparation is required. The Apostle Paul often compares the Christian journey to a race where we're our only competition!
