GREGORY CELEBRATES 60 YEARS!

On Sunday, September 11, Gregory celebrated 60 years as a chartered Presbyterian Church. While the congregation had ministered in Prince George since 1887, it was on September 16, 1951 that the church severed its ties to 2nd Church Petersburg and called its first pastor, the Rev. Frank Lemmon (who also served Rosewood Presbyterian Church.)

Fifty-three members joined in 1951, some of whom had grown up at Gregory; others transferred from other churches. Of that number, five are still active at Gregory. Those five are Christine Belsches, Elizabeth and H.F. Scott, Katherine Tompkins, and Gladys Wiseman. At worship on the 11th, we celebrated the faithful service of those folks, and all were able to be present except for Elizabeth Scott.

During a recognition ceremony, Christine, H.F., Katherine and Gladys shared brief thoughts about the passing of those decades, and they renewed their membership vows. The congregation renewed its support of these longestserving members with the words, "We promise to support and pray for these, our charter members, to listen to their wise counsel and to give thanks for their faithful service to this congregation and to their Lord!" and a standing ovation of thanksgiving. Verses from the familiar hymns, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" and "The Church's One Foundation" were sung as they were at the original chartering ceremony.

BACK-TO-CHURCH SUNDAY MEANT FUN, IN THE BIBLICAL SENSE!

September 11 also marked, "Back to Church Sunday" for Sunday School participants. It began with a delicious brunch served up by members of the Christian Education Committee. Mark Sprowl then led singing "This Little Light of Mine" and other favorites followed by Bible-inspired games.

Based on the TV show, "Bible Jeopardy" tested knowledge of Bible

"people," "places," "things," and "animals." We had four-way tie for winner. Several Sunday School students found their "inner" Kermit or Miss Piggy as they pantomimed movements of animal hand puppets for an interpretation of the last days on Noah's ark. The morning ended with a fast-and-furious construction of Duplo projects for the "Terrible, Teetering Tower of Babel Contest." In the picture, the game master measures the height of the winning entry, but all were congratulated for the building prowess and reminded that the actual winners in the Bible's "Tower of Babel" got to learn a new foreign language!

NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL CURRICULUM NEEDS LEADERS

Beginning January, 2012, Gregory will be using a new children's Sunday School curriculum, Rock Solid. Chosen from

among several possibilities, Rock Solid is biblical, engaging for children and has many helps for the teacher. It offers learning at several different levels making it possible for children of different age groups to be included in the same class. Those who've helped out with "Jr. Church" will recognize the quality of the program as it's a version of what we've been using with the younger children during the worship time.

In order to maintain some continuity in the program and make it easier for our teachers, we are asking teachers to teach only for one month at a time, 9:45-10:30 am on Sunday mornings. Class size varies from one to six on a given Sunday morning. Interpretative assistance for the teacher is also available. Some teachers have already volunteered but we need more to make good on that vow we make to support children and parents when the children are baptized.

After that, it will be posted online for prospective candidates to view.

There is a matching process done by the Church Leadership Connection (CLC) matching our CIF with the Pastor Information Forms (PIF) from the prospective candidates. It is at this point that we begin receiving applications to review.



How can you help our committee in this task? Continue to pray for God's guidance of the PNC, that he will give us insight, vision, and wisdom to evaluate the candidates whose applications we receive. We firmly believe that God has chosen our next pastor, and that we only need to "weed through the garden" to find the one he has chosen. 
