



"And Now a Word from our Investments and Our Capital Improvements Fund......"

Our church is fortunate to have been left a legacy from a former member, Lewis B. Wilson. At the time of his gift, an investment committee was formed as a sub-committee of the Stewardship and Finance committee. The committees met and solicited investment advisors and ultimately chose to self direct some investments and also work with Wachovia Securities, now Wells Fargo Advisors.

As an institutional investor, the investments that the Church sought after revolved around principal preservation and income production from dividends and interest. As such, the income derived from the investments has been utilized over the years for operating purposes, capital purchases and most recently as seed money for the Pastor Nominating committee.

In years past, we transferred anywhere from \$300 to as much as \$700 monthly from the general fund into a capital improvements fund to set aside monies for emergency building repairs and smaller capital projects. However, for 2012, the Session chose not to continue with funding the capital improvements accounts with a \$300 monthly transfer. We started this year with \$3,430.83 in the capital improvements fund but now it is depleted due to projects we've undertaken. We are now considering having a special collection taken up each month to fund this account.

Below is a recap of how we've used investment principal, earnings from the investments and the beginning of the year monies:

As you can see, we've liquidated almost \$24,000 of investments and we will not have the \$3,000 of earnings to be used going forward. Please give prayerful consideration as to how we should proceed with re-funding the Capital Improvements Fund. We still have plenty of physical facilities needs awaiting our attention. If you have any questions or suggestions, please contact me or anyone on the Stewardship & Finance or Facilities committee.


