Advent and Christmas Time

"In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, 'Greetings, you who are highly favored!' The Lord is with you."

(Luke 1:26-28, NIV)

In faithful response, God the Father (creator), God the Son (savior), and God the Holy Spirit (sustainer) asks that each one of us "be with God." Amidst all of the rush of the holiday season, and in spite of the joy and anxiety that fills many a human heart, followers of the Christ are being called to an inner journey: a journey imbued with its own rhythm and cadence – its own unique spirit and faith.

Such a journey begins with the Season of Advent (Sunday, December 2, 2012) - as we begin a new Christian year in preparation and anticipation of the birth and second coming of Jesus Christ. Before you know it, Christmas Eve has arrived and so has Christmas Day. But for

This moment grants us witness to the arrival of Three Wise Men bearing gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh to an infant baby boy – God Incarnate. How simple, how true!

ADVENT TRADITION: POINSETTIAS IN THE CHURCH SANCTUARY

The tradition of placing memorial poinsettias in the Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church Sanctuary began decades ago. The live, red poinsettia plants were purchased by congregational members and their families and displayed in the Sanctuary during Advent.

Under the watchful eye of a volunteer, the plants are watered and tended until the night of the Christmas Eye service. After the service, the poinsettias are taken home for the enjoyment of family and friends, or gifted to a special someone.

Poinsettias may be purchased at a cost of \$10.50 each, with checks written payable to: "Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church." The deadline for receiving all orders is December 2.

To place your order for a lovely, live red poinsettia, write

your name on the Poinsettia Order sheet on the Narthex table. Be sure to provide detailed wording for the memorial information, or the name of person you wish to honor, on the Order sheet.

A Special Remembrance List that will include the names of those to whom the poinsettias are dedicated will be included in the Bulletin for the last Sunday of December.

LITURGICAL COLORS OF THE CHURCH SEASON

Here's an Explanation of the Liturgical Colors:

White symbolizes joy, purity, and truth. It is used for special days in the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, such as Christmas and Easter.

Gold is sometimes used in place of white.

Purple or Violet symbolizes penitence, preparation, and expectation during the seasons of Advent and Lent (through Maundy Thursday).

Blue is sometimes used in place of Purple/Violet.

Black symbolizes deep sorrow and is used on Good Friday as well as funeral services.

Red symbolizes fire and blood, and is used on Pentecost Sunday as well as ordination services.

Green symbolizes God's creation, the color of living things as well as spiritual growth and is used for all other time periods not marked by a specific season (Ordinary Time)
