

The Session of Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church held its monthly meeting on Tuesday, March 19, 2013 and approved the following items: The monthly meeting of the Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church Session was held on Tuesday, March 19, 2013 at 7 p.m. and the following actions were taken:

- 1. Approved entering into an HVAC maintenance contract with Virginia Heating and Cooling at a cost of \$785.00 per year.
- 2. Approved the replacement of the outdoor compressor unit and the air-handler which serves the first floor Fellowship Hall at a cost of \$7,510.00.
- 3. Approved the membership of the Worship Committee.
- 4. Approved the donation of \$250.00 to "Smile Train" from the Missions Committee.
- 5. Approved the request from the church secretary to have off the dates of March 26th and March 27th. The office will be closed on those dates.
