

A Donation of \$15.00 will buy a turkey for an area family in need. **CCHASM** will once again be holding its Thanksgiving Meal Gift Package Program to help area residents who normally would not be able to afford a holiday meal with their family. The CCHASM package includes a \$15.00 gift card to purchase a turkey and a Bag of Thanksgiving food (valued at approximately \$25.00). Your Cash Donation toward a gift card or gift package (see content list below) will provide an area family in need with a Thanksgiving Meal (and lot's of leftovers). In 2012 CCHASM was able to provide Thanksgiving Meal Gift Packages and a \$15.00 Gift Card to <u>2331 families (8474 adults and children)</u>. Our goal this year is to reach 2500 families through our two programs.

- The first distribution will be <u>Saturday</u>, <u>Nov. 16th</u> at the Hopewell VFW on Lynchburg St. for residents living in Hopewell and Prince George.
- The second distribution will take place at the Chesterfield County Fairgrounds Exhibition Center on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>November 23rd</u> and will be for area residents living in Chesterfield, Colonial Heights, and Dinwiddie.

Each Thanksgiving Meal Gift Package will include the following food items plus a \$15 Gift Card to purchase a turkey:

1 – 40 ounce can of yams or sweet potatoes	2 – bags of stuffing mix or 2 boxes of Stove Top® stuffing
1 – 13 ounce box of instant mashed potatoes	2 – cans or packages of gravy
1 – 14 ounce can of cranberry sauce	1 – box of hot chocolate
2 – 15 ounce cans of corn	1 – box tea bags
2 – 15 ounce cans of green vegetables	1 – box or bag of cookies

*CCHASM is a 501 (c) (3) whose mission is: To provide food, financial assistance, and career clothing to area residents who have experienced or are experiencing an emergency situation which threatens their survival needs. CCHASM has been serving area residents for over 25 years through its 24 Alliance Food Pantries, Career Clothes Closet for Women, and with utility, rent, and other financial assistance as funds are available. Its largest program of the year is the Thanksgiving Meal Gift Package Program.
