

Dear Gregory Memorial, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



"And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." \sim John 1:14

he ornaments and decorations started showing up in the stores back in September, well before Halloween, even. In my home area, one of the more well-known radio stations began their 24/7 playing of the seasonal music in the first week of November. Some people are happy with these realities; others...not so much. To some, it is a downright scandal to introduce Christmas before we have even gotten into the month of Thanksgiving, much less into December.

On a purely personal note, I am one such person. I have a difficult time of it every year, seeing how early stores and radio stations and television commercials begin advertising Christmas, and all the shopping that is "required" to go along with it. To be honest, it irks me to the point that I can easily relate to Dickens' infamous character, Scrooge.

And yet, I know that there are people in the world, in our community, and even in the families of some of you reading this that would be perfectly happy if Christmas music was played year-round. I recognize that I tend to disagree with such a sentiment, and in the middle of August I find it scandalous, but I also have come to this conclusion: My idea of such a scandal regarding Christmas pales in comparison to the true scandal, and from such the true meaning, of Christmas.

The awaited and long-expected Messiah was anticipated to be a warrior-king who would come in glory and fanfare, routing the foreign nations with his mighty sword and redeeming the people of Israel once and for all. Instead, Messiah came quietly as a fragile, newborn babe to a poor family in the middle of the night.

And if that weren't scandal enough, the very idea that a God that was so holy, so divine, so *other* and

incorruptible, would ever stoop to the level of humanity...well, that idea was so scandalous that it was never even truly considered (though it *was* prophesied).

It seems that the Christmas season, the true Christmas season, is one full of scandal – of God's chosen and anointed One arriving in ordinary humility; of the Holy and Divine God taking on the full trappings of humanity to walk among us, with us, showing us a better way, an *achievable* way of connecting with God; of reconciliation with those that would disobey and disagree, rather than ostracizing and punishing them, pushing them away.

If God was willing to go to such scandalous lengths to reconcile mortal humanity with divine holiness...well, then I guess I can put up with seeing decorations and hearing music out of "season." Because, when it comes down to it, every season is now one in which we can approach God, and be reconciled through Christ, who walked among us, fully human and fully divine, born of a mother, to erase the lines of separation and division. Our season of Advent is the two-fold remembering of this truth, and calling us to make the ultimate hope of such reconciliation a reality.

That does call for some joyous music, indeed. May this Advent season lead to the deepest of Christmas blessings.


THE CLERK'S CORNER

My name is Bryan Hudgins, and I am a Life Scout of Troop 900 chartered by Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church. Since becoming a Life Scout, I have been in search of an Eagle project to help the community, and after participating in our annual Scout Sunday in the Temple Building, I have realized where my help was needed most. After seeing the struggle that many of the members of our chartering organization faced while attempting to access the festivities in the Temple Building, mainly due to the fact that there is a lack of an entrance designed for the disabled or elderly, I have decided to make my project revolve around solving this problem. This means that I intend to install a handicap ramp on the front facing entrance of the Temple Building to make all Scout and Church events located in the building accessible to all.

After finally deciding what my project could be and getting it approved, I now move to the most crucial part of the project: Fundraising. In order for my project to begin, I must first begin by raising money. I have begun this process by sending leteters asking for donations, and starting a scrap metal recycling fund. However, I am still not close to my goal. Based on the materials we are going to need, a rough estimate of \$3,000 will need to be raised before any construction can begin. After realizing how much money was still needed to be raised, I began to talk to Mr. Foster. One of the suggested routes of action was to send out a letter to the congregation asking for help, so here I am!
