

omes have been very much on my mind recently, as you may not be surprised to hear (and once again, a huge thank you to everyone who helped paint, move, and/or feed us during that process!).

And I've been especially pondering what makes a house a home in light of this invitation by Jesus to the first disciples, spoken above to Andrew and Simon Peter (later repeated by Philip to Nathaniel when they joined Jesus).

As you may recall from a recent sermon, this is perhaps my favorite invitation to discipleship, "Come, and see." It is neither a treatise, nor a theological or even evangelism debate...it is simply and straightforward an invitation. No commitment required, just see, and make a decision for yourself. In other words, it's a hint that your hopes and expectations, even the hopes you're afraid to hope for, may just be filled-full in amazing and wonderful, perhaps even unexpected ways!

But I believe there's more here. Immediately following Jesus' response and invitation to Andrew and Simon Peter, they join him at his home and stay for several hours. I don't know about you, but when I go to someone's house and spend several hours, there are two

things present: good food and good conversation. In short, hospitality and relationship.

And this is the two-fold invitation we have to receive and to give: hospitality and relationship. It is, also, I believe, what makes a house a home, a place of warmth and welcome, a place of support and strength, of rest and renewal. It is what our church is to be - a house of Christian welcome and nurture to the hungry, hurting, yearning and poor, in spirit and in body, of this world.

We do this, and I believe we can always do this better, more completely. How might we make our house of worship, our church, our home, more welcoming, more supporting, more warm in hospitality and relationship?

This is the invitation I will be continuing to ponder in weeks to come, with Session and others. I look forward to your presence in this pondering and conversation. After all, it is not our own invitation that we respond to, or carry into the world; it is our Lord's. Let us warmly invite others into his home!
