

"So they took Jesus; and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of The Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus between them."

~John 19:16b-18

y now, we are a little more than half-way through Lent. We may be tired of singing the slightly minor hymns – where are the joyous "Alleluias"? We may be tired of hearing how this is a journey, a road which we travel as we draw closer to God – enough of the journey, when do we arrive? All around us (hopefully) we are seeing more and more signs of Spring, and thoughts of Easter morning are drawing our eyes to the horizon.

But first, we must go through the dark nights of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

We often want to skip ahead to Easter morning – the lilies, the pastel colors, the joyous good news of the empty tomb (made all the tastier with the chocolate eggs and bunnies, sure signs of Spring if ever there were any!). After all, is this not the culmination of the time of Lent, the empty tomb and the resurrection? Yes, but there is no resurrection if there is no death, first. There is no empty tomb if there is not a corpse, first.

One of the reasons we so often want to skip ahead is that we are often uncomfortable with death, in general – the unknown aspects of it, the loss of loved ones, the grief and sadness...we would much rather skip over all of that, if we are able. Avoid it all together, if possible.

And yet, Jesus went to the cross, to the execution, to open the door for the in-breaking of God's Kingdom and the salvation of humanity and creation, by first embracing death.

In the final installment of the <u>Harry Potter</u> series, Harry is told the fable of three brothers who sought to cheat Death and seek immortality. Two of them fail, rather quickly, whereas the third brother is able to live a long life, at the end of which he no longer sees Death as an enemy, but as a companion to be welcomed.

In living a good and full life, death is no longer a punishment, but simply a reality. The goal is no longer to achieve immortality (fear/avoidance of death), but rather to live a rich and meaningful life.

In going to the cross, Jesus accomplished so many things. The one that means the most to me is that death is no longer the final curtain, and as such it is not to be feared. In dying, Christ offered salvation to the world; in his resurrection, death lost the power to separate and cause us to live in fear. We are now free to live amazing and joyous lives because death is no longer the final word. The good news is that the bad news is no longer the final news!

What an amazing Easter gift! But we are not quite there, yet. First, on our way to Easter morning, we join Jesus at the foot of the cross, and walk with him. We continue to prepare for this point.

Will you join us on that hill, and witness the sacrifice made, that we might no longer fear death, and instead embrace the love of life? We will gather on <u>Maundy Thursday</u>, <u>April 17</u>, <u>at 7:00 p.m.</u>, to begin the culmination of this season.
