

have a vague memory that, when I was child, my mother "strongly encouraged" me to join the children's choir at our church. I'm pretty sure I didn't want to, or at least, didn't feel strongly about it. But I did, and I practiced, and sang, and over the years, the practice stuck. I moved up to regular choir. I sang in choir in high school and select choir after that. I sang in theater productions. And I sing still today, the lone white robe sticking out in the choir loft each week. *And I'm grateful to be able to do so.*

Music is a powerful force in our lives. How many of our memories, good and sorrowful, are connected to a certain song? How often do we have a favorite song running through our minds and hearts as we go about our days? And now, more and more research is showing the positive effects, mental and physical, for those who sing regularly, and who sing with others. "With singing, we can train our lungs to breathe better. Singing has also been shown to boost our immune system, reduce stress levels, and…help patients cope with chronic pain." (Sarah Rainey, *The Telegraph*, 10 July 2013).

Similarly, Ilene Serlin, Ph.D., reports in *Psychology Today* (March 26, 2014) that "communal singing has, since ancient times, been a source of physical and emotional rejuvenation. It has helped create and sustain communities, helped individuals feel less isolated, and lifted mood and motivation."

I really don't think that anyone is necessarily surprised by this, even if we may feel that we are not good singers in the first place. Music is, and has been throughout time, a formative aspect of society and community, and especially in religion. Our Scriptures are filled to overflowing with songs and instances of songs...our faith heritage is set to music. Is it any wonder that we strive to offer the best musical offerings in our times of worship – not only on Sundays, but also to mark special events such as weddings and funerals? I don't believe so.

And we at Gregory Memorial are about to continue the journey forward in the music of our congregation. Recently, the PC(USA) released a new, updated and expanded hymnal. And at the request of her family, the funds received in memorial of Katherine Tompkins will be used toward the purchase of them. Some of the benefits of making this switch include: books that are thinner and lighter, yet have more hymn offerings; liturgy and prayers included, meaning we won't need to print them in the bulletin; more opportunity to infuse our worship with the music that has meant so much to us over the generations.

The goal is already almost met, and in coming months, you'll hear more about how you can help us reach the overall goal. And at some point in the Fall, we'll use our time of worship to dedicate these new hymnals, honor Katherine and her family for this gift, and remember the One who creates music through us in the first place. Let us all make a joyful noise, to the glory of God!




