s your tree still up and decorated? Even though the celebrations of the day are now past, are the trappings of Christmas still evident around your home? In other corners of society, Christmas decorations have disappeared, replaced by signs to get everything needed for New Year's Eve, Valentine's Day, St. Patrick's Day, and possibly even Easter.

Has your household followed a similar pattern, or do signs of Christmas – tree with lights and decorations, Nativity crèche on the mantle, the Advent wreath now with only the Christ-candle lit, and other family favorites still claim visible space?

They should. We, of the Christian faith, are still fully and completely in the midst of the Christmas season, which began for us on the morning of December 25 (though we may have started a little early on Christmas Eve), and goes all the way through to the Epiphany of the Lord, typically January 6, commemorating the search of Magi for the newborn (or toddler) king. (Incidentally, this is where we get the Twelve Days of Christmas!)

I n short: Whatever anyone may tell you, it is still Christmas, and the joy of the season is still evident and prevalent for all!

Yay! And Merry (continued) Christmas to all!

I pray for each of us that, as we enter into a new calendar year, we would carry over within our hearts the reality that the season in which we celebrate and commemorate the birth of Immanuel, God-With-Us, both closes out one calendar year and opens up the next. The joy, the peace, the promise of the Kingdom of God come near bookends each and every calendar year. Do we sense it? Do we realize and practice such a reality? Does the joy and peace of Christmas Day truly go with us for the next twelve days?

Even though we celebrate it each year as a twelve day period, scholars posit that the visit of the Magi was an event that actually occurred not within the first few days of Jesus' birth, but within the first few years. For my own personal spirituality, I like this idea: The journey to seek out Immanuel is not a one-day affair, but a longer journey. It will take me the better part of Christmas Day to drive to be with family; it will take the discipline and endurance of a much longer spiritual journey to draw close to Christ.

Regardless, what it all comes down to is this: Do not sell the Christmas season short, or allow it to drift away from you too quickly. Savor these days, this season. Allow it to be present with you in each of these Twelve days, and remind yourself as you awaken each morning to seek out the newborn king, the world's Immanuel, and to allow his Light to become your light in the world.

"May the peace and joy of this season be with you each and every day of this season." My wish and hope for each of you in these holy days.
