

## Dear Gregory Memorial, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



"For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and death." ~Romans 8:2

Tread an interesting article recently based on studies of religious homes vs. secular homes. While I would argue that this article, like so many articles everywhere, was painted with a somewhat broad brush, the results of the study being reported were fairly conclusive: Those children raised in a secular home were showing greater characteristics of tolerance, anti-racism, anti-sexism, and fewer tendencies of vengeance and succumbing to peer-pressure. (*Bengtson, Vern L: Longitudinal Study of Generations*). The article, in short, states that not believing in God is not synonymous with being amoral.

Which is good news, typically. I'd like to think that morality is possible regardless of the situations of one's upbringing, and we know that the world can use as many morally-minded people as possible. But it got me wondering and asking myself: If secular families are providing a framework of positive ethics and morality better than religious families, where did religion go wrong?

After all, from the beginning of Jewish history, oral and then written, humanity has had the kinds of laws in place which would steer each of us toward proper and uplifting treatment of one another, of living in right and positive relationship in society, with each other and with God. And when Jesus arrived, Immanuel God-With-Us, that only solidified: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you (Luke 6:31 – the Sermon on the Plain). Treat each other as you would treat God, for each of us is made in the Divine Image, and is a child of God.

For centuries, religious homes have had the very foundation of right living with others in this world at our fingertips. So why, then, does a 40+ year study of our society show that secular homes are outpacing religious homes in instilling these attitudes? I do not have a quick answer, but I do have speculations. One of these is that we so often find comfort in attempting to live by the letter of the law, comfort in making the decision of 'who is in and who is out,' that we forget to live by the spirit of the law. We forget that the law, in the first place, is only a written interpretation of what should be within our hearts, in the fibers of our very being: Each person we come across is a child of God, who has received the invitation to new life made possible in our resurrected Lord.

Furthermore, it is easy to get caught up in simply going through the motions, and forgetting what the motions are supposed to strengthen within us. Attending worship, volunteering, participating in mission and outreach, reading the Scriptures, spending individual time in prayer...these are not simply actions to check-off on a daily or weekly schedule, but are practices to keep us attuned to the presence of God, the love of Christ, the calling to be agents of the Kingdom of Heaven, wherever and whenever we may be. We cannot simply go through the motions.

As I move through this season of Lent, as I prepare to meet Christ again at the cross, and then the tomb, and then the empty tomb, I will focus on this truth: That Christ came into this world for all the world, and if I in any way am telling someone otherwise, then I am missing the mark. It is their choice to accept this truth or not; but as one who has already accepted it, it is my calling to continue to extend the Christ's invitation to new life. To everyone. I will not be content with simply going through the motions. I will not take my comfort in being one who is 'in the know.' I will work to keep myself grounded in Christ, and reaching out into the world.

I don't care if secular households do this well, also, if they are able to instill morality and right-living in society. I just don't want to be one of the religious households that does it worse. Christ's love means too much to me. I know it means just as much to you.
