Dear Gregory Memorial, Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



"I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

~Isaiah 43:19

Recently, this verse has been on my mind. Perhaps it's because it's spring, and the season makes our hearts look toward new things, to cleaning out the cobwebs and dusting off what is present to make way for new life and refreshed vision. Perhaps it's because our church building has, in many ways, been made new after the broken pipe two months ago, or because I've been rearranging my study. Perhaps it's because this verse is on the bulletin board outside the administrative offices, but recently this verse has been on my mind.

Often, when we hear this proclamation/question/ proclamation through the prophet Isaiah, we are called upon to hear with joy, with faith, with an openness to whatever it is that God is doing anew. We may even wonder, silently if not out loud, whether or not we're faithful enough if we're not sure we perceive it. Have we missed something? Is there something more that we should be doing? We strive to do more. We desire to hear and discern, follow and get on board. 'If it is of God,' we say, 'then we will follow along.'

But when we are being the most honest with ourselves, we must also admit that the change, the new things, of God or not, also make us uncomfortable and uncertain. You've heard me say time and again that the first words out of an angel's mouth are "Fear not" because the presence of God can be so overwhelming, and I hold to that. But often when the angel appears it is to bring news of a new thing, a change, a different path than what was originally planned. The angel's "Fear not" then applies to our natural tendency to be afraid of

the change that is coming.

Not all change is good; change simply for the sake of change is not necessarily better. We are indeed called to discern the presence and call of God, but I want to remind us all (myself included) that we trust in a God who is steadfastly faithful to us, who will lead us as a good shepherd, who will bring us into Life Abundant. I believe that we are promised a good and rich life, though not an easy life. And it is God who will bring us there.

It is ok to be uncertain and anxious at times; the people of Israel certainly exhibited those qualities during the time in the wilderness! But we are indeed being led to the place we ought to be. Our call is indeed to follow in faith, not ignoring our uncertainty or anxiety, but despite it. And to help bring this point home, we celebrate the One who has overcome the greatest change with the most uncertainty, death itself, and through his resurrection, Christ offers us all the ability to follow in faith as disciples, and apostles of the Good News. May we do this ever more in this new season!


