

hen I was younger I was extremely competitive. As a swimmer, I wanted nothing more than to excel in my event, the 100 yard butterfly. I was always looking for the edge, practicing the minutiae to get every little dynamic of my technique perfected, for one goal and one goal only: to win at my event. I even voluntarily attended double-practices, using the second one to increase stamina or speed, or to work on shaving time off my start and turns, to streamline my movement through the water. All so that I could win. While swimming is a team sport, it is the collection of individual events, and I wanted my individual event to be unchallenged. It was personal, for me. Sure, I was helping the team win, but if the team won while I didn't win my event, it still felt somewhat like a loss. In order to feel that I was where I needed to be, I needed to win.

Looking back I might wonder why I ever became a Buffalo Bills fan. I guess my 'hometown loyalty' wins out against overall winning. I think perhaps it's something more.

Because somewhere along the line, my understanding of 'winning' began to shift. A concept that used to be defined solely by coming in first, or at the very least by personally improving my time, slowly began to shift to an understanding that to 'win' had nothing at all to do with what place I came in, and had everything to do with what was being accomplished. And the source of this shift was the gospel, as I came to claim it as something that influenced my life, not just as something that we talked about at church.

I began to understand that winning no longer meant coming in first, or being the best, but that 'winning' was the realizing, the working toward, the proclaiming the Kingdom of God. Winning became synonymous with living out God's Vision of the world, instead of beating everyone else out to the finish line. The prize was no longer the blue ribbon or the trophy, but rather the prize was making sure everyone knew God's love in Christ, knew their identity as a beloved child of God. This understanding of 'winning' became far more meaningful than any sporting accomplishment or record.

While working in campus ministry in Texas, our collegiate group often formed intramural teams - softball and volleyball were the two favorites. Our slogan became "Life of a Child!" because we kept referencing the adage that in a hundred years we would not be remembered for our bank accounts, cars or houses, but whether or not we made a positive impact in the life of a child. And we are all, regardless of age, children of God.

While I still support the Bills (much to the amusement of many), and now the Nationals, and I love the Olympics, my understanding of what qualifies as winning in life is still based on this model of the gospel. We are each children of God, and we are each loved beyond measure. The more I proclaim this, the more I win, and the more this world reflects God's vision for the Kingdom. Let us all run this race together.


