

Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



But the angel said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." ~Mark 16:6-7 (also Matthew 28:5-6, 10)

e didn't want to leave Galilee, along the shore of the Sea of Galilee (also known as the Lake of Tiberius). Galilee, with its softly rolling hills and beautiful shorelines, is a gorgeous region, and it's not hard to imagine why Jesus, along with the disciples, chose to make it a home base for the majority of his ministry. Walking along the hillsides, standing on the cliffs overlooking the water, the feeling of walking where Jesus walked is tangible, and the stories of our faith are alive. When it was time to leave Galilee, we did not want to go.

After the resurrection, the angel proclaims that Jesus is alive, and will meet the disciples and the women in Galilee, as he told them. When this is combined with the account of the appearance of Jesus to the disciples in the boat (John 21:4-19), the image is one not simply of gladness, but of joyous reunion, the kind of reunion that can only come from intimately close family and friends after a too-long absence. For instance, as soon as Peter realizes who it is, he jumps out of the boat and makes his way to shore – he can't wait any longer! And not only is the reunion joyous, it is in the home area, the place where all the good memories and formative experiences took place.

In short, all is once again right with the world, and in that moment, nothing can be wrong or bad.

This day, this Easter season, this time of reunion is indeed joyous, and life-giving. It is beyond words, this experience that I am blessed to share with each of you, gathered on this day to proclaim the fullness of our faith.

But while we proclaim this joy on this day, and in the weeks of the Easter season to come, the truth is much more profound.

We are not limited or confined to this joyous reunion only in Easter, but in reality, each and every time we gather – Sunday mornings, luncheons and dinners, in times of celebration and yes, even in times of sorrow. Every time we gather as the community of faith, the family of Christ, we step again into this joyous reunion. Sometimes we come with hearts light and free, other times we are heavy and weighed down, but what is important is that we come. When we enter into this reunion celebration, when we show up, then everything else in our lives is not dismissed, but it is put into perspective, and we are reminded of how rich our lives truly are.

May you indeed be blessed in this Easter season, and in every season. May you know the joyous reunion with Christ every time you enter into worship and fellowship. May your life be defined by the resurrected Life. How can we keep from singing, when such a joy is ours to live into? Thank you for these blessings and more; now let us invite the whole world to know such joy!


