

ow's your schoolwork going? Are you keeping up with your reading? Are you working on your assignments?

These are the questions I've been asked most regularly since I began my Doctor of Ministry program a few months ago. And I'm happy, each time, to respond with 'yes' to all of them. I'm excited to share this journey with you; one of the aspects that truly makes this academic program different from others is the expectation that the student be in full-time ministry with a congregation. I couldn't be in this program if I wasn't in ministry, because it is expected that the learning I undertake not be done for myself alone, but should directly benefit the congregation, as well, growing us all as disciples of Christ and ministers of God! And I am very excited that I have the privilege to do this with you in particular.

And so, here's the 'official' invitation: It would give me great joy if you would join me in this program of study and learning, of growth and increased discipleship.

To that end, I'd like to tell you a bit about what will be coming in the next few weeks. For the first three Sundays in May (the 1st, the 8th, and the 15th) I will be delving into Paul's Letter to Philemon in the sermons, looking at how this brief letter can help us better live into the reconciling work of the Kingdom of God. At the end of this time, I'll have a *brief* survey to be filled out, for those who are willing to do so.

This will directly go into my current assignment, for my next seminar in June, which is to use the book of Philemon in a ministry project, and then reflect upon it. By attending worship, by engaging in this conversation with me, and by responding to my survey, you will be helping me complete my assignment.

But that's not all! On Sunday, May 15, we'll be having a Third Sunday Luncheon, at which I'll be giving you more information about this program overall – how long I anticipate it to last, what I plan to focus on, what I hope my project will be, and other ways in which the congregation can support me along the way, plus answering any other questions you may have. I want to share as much of this with you as I can, because I am genuinely excited about what I'm doing and I want to share it with you, every step of the way. I hope you'll make a point of joining us for lunch and discussion on that Sunday.

In the meantime, may we all continue to learn and relearn the lessons of our Master, to be instructed and guided by them for the edification of all.


