

hile Paul's letters are primarily written to address certain and specific issues in a community, they also hold a deeper purpose – a way to keep in touch and keep people updated on what's going on. That's been one of the primary purposes of letters in society, though letters now are largely replaced by emails and texts.

And as there has been much going on this summer, I thought I would use this space to give all of you some brief updates.

At the end of June, the Presbyterian Church (USA) held its 222<sup>nd</sup> General Assembly, in Portland, Oregon. During this assembly, the following of note took place:

-For the first time in history, a pair of Co-Moderators was elected (as opposed to Moderator and Vice-Moderator). Revs. Jan Edmiston and Denise Anderson will represent the PC(USA) for the next two years.

-Stated Clerk Gradye Parsons retired; he was replaced by the election of Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson.

-The Assembly took the following actions, among others: ratified the inclusion of "The Confession of Belhar" in our *Book of Confessions*; proposed an updated and revised *Book of Common Worship*; expressed hope for a two-state solution in Israel and Palestine; decided against divestment from fossil fuel companies; determined that ministers shall again carry the title of 'Minister of Word and Sacrament'.

I completed the second seminar for my Doctor of Ministry program, held again in Louisville, Kentucky. It was beyond joy to share that part of our country with these friends. Megan commented it was a miracle I ever actually left! She's right, of course, but there is nowhere I would rather be than here, with you, in this time.

These are all wonderful and joyful opportunities you afford me, and I am deeply grateful for them. My joy at being in community with you is beyond description, and as nice as it is to go visiting, it is better to return home.
