

Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you shall know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

- John 8:31-32

In the weeks leading up to Christmas I, like many, did the things and traditions that help get me in the right frame of mind. One of my personal traditions is to watch the movie *Love Actually* (2003). To some, this movie may not epitomize the Christmas spirit, and others have found it to be too disconnected in the stories of its characters. But one of the themes that runs throughout the movie is that, at Christmastime, you tell the truth. [Note: While I like this movie, I do not recommend it for children; it contains themes and language more suitable to adults.]

Sometimes this truth is to another person, sometimes it is to yourself. Sometimes it creates a new opportunity, other times it is painful, and still other times it has unexpected results. But throughout the movie, we see stories in which the characters find themselves living into the truth, and learning what is important to them.

And while we celebrate anew the in-breaking to our world of the Divine Light in human form, God-With-Us, Christmastime becomes another opportunity to take a truthful look at our lives, and to determine what needs to be done to live more fully into the life of discipleship to which we have each been called.

Jesus, caught in a discussion regarding his identity and ministry, speaks to the crowds that are around him, crowds consisting of his disciples, the Pharisees, perhaps some Romans, and a gathering of Jews. To them he proclaims that, in discipleship to him, they will know truth, and truth has a way of setting us free. Not necessarily from physical things which may bind us, but our spirits and hearts are set free to follow God more closely, to proclaim God more fully.

And in this Christmas season (remember, Christmas begins on December 25 and goes through early January!), as well as in this coming New Year, we have the opportunity to look at our own lives, our own hearts, and truthfully determine if there are things that need to change so that we might be stronger disciples.

Looking at my own life and ministry, I see that there are things I need to change. Over the years here, I have allowed my schedule to be defined by the office tasks I thought needed to be done, and that the best way for me to a) do those tasks, and b) be faithful to this ministry was to be at the church very specific hours. In today's world of cell phones and mobile email, I wonder if this is still accurate. I don't know that it is, and so I plan to shift my daily schedule to make sure that more of my energy is spent away from the desk at church, and out in the community, visiting people and building relationships. (All the other tasks will still get done, not to worry, but they will no longer receive the most attention). After nearly a decade, it's a bit hard for me to realize I've become misguided, but it's true, and I intend to make that right.

What areas of your life might need tweaking, in order to live into the truth that a life in Christ brings? How might you go about making those changes? How can we at Gregory Memorial help?

Christ has come again, once more bearing the Light of God into the darkness of our world. This is cause for great joy and celebration, and while it means shining light in corners of our lives that we might rather leave darkened, it also means that the new life which comes after that is closer to the life God has in store for us. May this, along with the full blessings of our Lord, be your gift in this Christmas season!


