#### **Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,**



Immediately the father of the child cried out, "I believe; help my unbelief!" -Mark 9:24

If ind this to be one of the most honest prayers within our Scriptures. It is uttered by a man who has reached a point where he is no longer sure of what will happen next, or if everything will be alright. His son has been afflicted for years, with no relief or cure in sight, until he finally hears of Jesus and the miracles he has been performing. The desperate father brings his sick son to Jesus and begs for a similar healing. Jesus, in return, comments that all things are possible for those who believe. In his desperation and frustration, the father cries out that he believes, AND that he is not sure he can believe, at the same time, needing help from the Spirit to sustain him in his faith.

Friends, how often has this been us, and we have been afraid to say so? We have been taught that we should never show our uncertainty or our fear, as it is a sign of weakness, and weakness is frowned upon. We have been taught to hold strong to our faith, and never let it waiver, for that is what "true" Christianity is — unwavering faith, and to show otherwise implies that you're not truly a Christian. We have been taught and told, time and again, that there can be no room in our hearts, our minds, or our spirits for unbelief or doubt.

These teachings are misguided.

It is good for us to remember that our faith is founded in the One who is faithful, in all times and places. It is good for us to remember that our hope for this life and the next is based upon the life, death, and resurrection of the One who is able to secure our future, even when we don't deserve it (the very basis for grace). But it is just as true that we are, each and every one of us, human – broken, mortal, and failing. We will doubt, and this is natural in this life. "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief."

We are not the first to doubt, or feel uncertain when facing the future. Abraham, Moses, Samuel, David...all the founders of our faith found themselves doubting at one point or another. (Lord, I believe; help my unbelief). The disciples doubted, *especially* on the Saturday between Good Friday (when Jesus was taken from them

by death) and Easter morning (when Jesus showed himself resurrected)...a thought that I've been very mindful of as we again approach this Saturday of Holy Week (Lord, I believe; help my unbelief). And Jesus himself doubted, as he hung on the cross, wondering why he was forsaken by God, his own Father (I believe; help my unbelief).

I confess that there are times in ministry, even after ten-plus years, that I feel as if I have no idea what I'm doing. I find myself haunted by questions... 'Is this the right decision? Could I have done more? Did I really offer anything of benefit?' and I know I'm not the first church leader to be in this position (Lord, I believe; help my unbelief).

And perhaps you have felt this way in your life, as well: haunted by questions, facing an uncertain future... 'What will happen as we face this illness? How will the bills be paid? Will I ever hear from them again?' As humans, we will face, more often than we would like, situations where we just don't know (Lord, I believe; help my unbelief).

One thing I have learned, though, is that the opposite of faith is not doubt. No, doubt is what enables faith to have the power it does. The author of the letter to the Hebrews reminds us still that "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). We have a great hope, born out of the promise of the only One who is able to offer us hope in the first place, and in that we place our faith. But, as I said, we are but human, frail and imperfect; we will doubt, and there is no shame in doubting honestly. As we again approach Easter, let us hold to our faith, especially when we doubt, so that we might hear again the resurrection promise of New Life, the reward of a life of faith. Lord, I believe; help my unbelief...


