was recently listening to an interview with Dave Jaegler, who supplies the radio play-by-play for the Washington Nationals (along with Charlie Slows). He was commenting that play-by-play is one of his favorite things to do, announcing with excitement the plays on the field and especially the "first of their kind" plays...listing off the highlights of the game, the things that get the fans excited and bring a great, positive energy to the game and the atmosphere.

He also mentioned, humorously, that he never intentionally set out get into radio announcing. "I actually started doing it not for our high school radio, but when I was player out in left field. There just wasn't a whole lot going on, and to pass the time I would mentally call a play-by-play of what everyone else was doing!"

Something else came to mind as I listened to Dave Jaegler's interview: he began calling play-by-play not as a passive observer, but as one who was actively participating in the game. But we cannot do what we do without your active and present participation. Thank you for all you do, but bless you for being a part of this congregation. And if you haven't been able to make it for a while, know that we miss you, and eagerly await your return. Great things are on the horizon.
