#### Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:19-21

remember an occasion when I was younger of how there was some toy I wanted, but didn't have enough money to purchase it. My parents, being the rotten, evil parents that they are, flat out refused to buy it for me, and instead forced upon me the chores of manual labor to earn my allowance and save up for said toy (I can't even remember what it was, now). But what I do remember is spending weeks obsessing about this toy: I would think of the grand ways it would enhance my overall entertainment...I would do almost continuous mental calculations comparing cost, how much I had saved, and how much more was needed...I eventually convinced myself that I couldn't live without it, and my life was incomplete until whatever this magical item was had been purchased. It was almost like it was life itself that I was saving up to buy.

There's a Latin term in the legal world that I think of when I remember this story, *sine qua non* – meaning, "the thing that, without which, life is not possible." If such a thing is *sine qua non*, it is essential, absolutely necessary, has no substitute and is indispensable. We might be able to say, as an example, that breathable air and drinkable water are both *sine qua non*, because without either of these things we literally, biologically cannot live.

While there are certainly things in this world that we cannot biologically live without, there are also things in our lives that, without which, life does not seem to have the same meaning. We may exist without them, but we might not feel as if we are living. I would say that some examples of these would be our families, our friends, and time to enjoy our hobbies and interests...the things that make living worthwhile. These, too, are *sine qua non*.

It would be our natural human tendency to try to store up these things, so that we are assured that there is always a ready supply. We want to secure for ourselves the treasures that make life worth living. Interestingly, this tendency is precisely what Jesus warns against. "Anything earthly that you try to store up for yourselves will eventually be lost - whether it fall apart and fade away or whether it be taken from you, you will not be able to keep it." Jesus knows all too well, and would have us remember that life on this earth is finite, and until God's Kingdom is fully realized (at the time and place of God's own choosing), then we are doomed to lose the things of this earth. Furthermore, our focus on such material things can distract us from the true gifts, the true treasure we have been offered. Whatever the toy was that I wanted would fall into the category of "something I shouldn't focus on", while the examples of family, friends, joy-filled experiences would fall into Jesus' example. These things are meaningful treasures.

But there is one more thing that I would remind you of, which is *sine qua non*: specifically, it is the grace and love of God, manifest in Jesus and enabled by the Holy Spirit. Without this grace and love – completely unearned by our own efforts but fully given by God – without this we have no life. Jesus came into the world to offer not just life, but Life Abundant, rich and meaningful life, life found in the fullness of God's presence and calling. This is *sine qua non*, and this treasure is given to us to store up. Let us seek it out; let us help others find it, as well – the more we share it, the greater it grows.

## CHRISTINE M. BELCHES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Christine M. Belches Memorial Scholarship fund was established in 2015 as a memorial to Christine M. Belches to provide financial assistance for ongoing educational opportunities. Christine was a long time member of Gregory Memorial and very much valued furthering the education of her own children. Her son Alan stated "she skimped and saved so that we would be able to continue our education." The scholarship is a way to honor her memory, a tribute to his mother who struggled and worked hard to make sure he and his brother were able to go to college.

Eligible applicants include members of Gregory Memorial Presbyterian Church, children and grandchildren of members of Gregory, and friends of Gregory who are actively involved and engaged in the church within the Tri-cities area.

Awards are determined by the applicant's needs, the number of applicants and the amount available for distribution. Applications will be accepted from Feb 1 to May 31 for Fall Semester and awarded prior to start of Fall Semester; and August 1 to November 30th for Spring Semester and awarded prior to Spring Semester.

Recipients are not obligated to repay these scholarships. They are awarded in love as part of our Christian ministry. However, we encourage former recipients, as well as others to contribute to this fund. All gifts (memorials, etc.) would be invested as part of the principal; thus, the initial gift is perpetuated and interest only will be awarded.

If a person chooses to contribute to this fund or memorials are given to this fund, a notation on the check or in writing must accompany the check. All gifts and memorials will be acknowledged and parties involved will be notified.
