

Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



"I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my Prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now."

-Philippians 1:3-5

he congregations of the early Christian church looked very different than they do today. Today, in any given community, there might be anywhere from five to fifty congregations and worshiping communities, of varying denominations and perspectives. But in the early Christian church, it is likely that any given community would have one congregation, and one congregation alone.

That congregation would be a "house-church," and while the name is drawn from the fact that such congregations met out of the house of a patron or sponsor, it implies much, much more. As a house-church, the congregation was not just a group of friends who got together when time allowed, nor was it excluded to the biological members of the family that lived in the house. Rather, the house-church was made up of the believers in that town or community, and they all came together, all the time, for everything. Biological relations or not, they were family; they were of one house: Christ's house.

And, as mentioned, they did everything as a family. I remember when I was younger I didn't always want to do the family events that my parents scheduled; I wanted to go off and do my own thing with my friends; going to see extended family almost always conflicted with that desire. Looking back, my parents (thankfully, now) overruled my petty desires and took me to see my family; we did things together. We showed up to support one another, to see one another, to celebrate and to mourn with one another, to share and experience life with one another.

And while this was true for my biological family which was spread over a few different states, it was also

true of my church family where I grew up. We, too, were much like a house-church, and we were family. Everyone in that church was either an aunt/uncle or a grandma/grandpa. The people my age and younger were brothers and sisters. We treated each other like family, and we did everything together. It was a wonderful blessing which I took too much for granted at the time.

This is not to say that it was always rosy and perfect. There were disagreements, there was confusion and occasionally hurt feelings. There was anxiety and uncertainty about the current or future state of things. There were the crazy "black sheep" members. And this is true not only of when I was growing up but of the early Christian church, as well – the reason we have all these letters from Paul and other apostles is because these house-churches had serious questions and made serious mistakes in how to best live out the gospel.

And we are still a house-church, today. We gather together not out of habit (hopefully), but because we want to see one another, to do the meaningful things of our lives together, and to work together to see the gospel proclaimed, together. Schedules and life may get in the way a bit more so now, but we are joined together to support one another, to live out the good news of Christ, and in this, we give thanks and celebrate. We are a house-church, you are family, and I can't wait to see you again!

AN OPEN LETTER FROM GREGORY MEMORIAL PRESCHOOL Janet W. Lammey, Preschool Director

Dear Parents and Guardians of Preschoolers,

Registration has begun for the 2018-2019 Academic School year! As you already know, Gregory Memorial Prescshool is a balanced program where your child will grow and learn in a cheerful, nurturing, and stimulating environment that emphasizs a love for learning.

Our curriculum focuses on the whole child by providing oportunities for social, emotional, and cognitive development. We incorporate English, math, science, Bible lessons, arts, music, and physical development in preparation for your child's kindergarten experience. Our classrooms and creative materials encourage interaction to promote your child's means of expression, creativity, problem-solving, and thinking. Playing with others, participating in small and large group activities, and following directions all help to enhance your child's emotional development.

The goal of our Preschool is to create a warm and caring environment to assist children in reaching their fullest learning potential. We believe that our Preschool objectives can be met in a 3-day learning program. While we will continue to operate on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, we will be shifting our timeframe to **9 a.m.** – **12 p.m.** (**Noon**) and will ask each parent to send a snack for their child, rather than a full lunch. This will provide us a greater amount of time to focus on academics.

Throughout the past 30 years, our child-centered curriculum, as well as our Gregory Memorial Preschool families, have made our program one of the most desired in Prince George County. Once again, our Preschool will offer a \$50 referral bonus, which can be used toward your child(ren)'s fees or tuition for the 2018-2019 academic year, if you refer a family who enrolls and begins our program in September of 2018. Upon the referred family starting our program, we will contact you in order to see how you would like your credit applied.

Eligibility: Children must be 3 years of age by <u>September 30</u> of the current school year. A copy of each child's birth certificate from their state of birth, as well as a copy of the child's immunization record is requested at registration and will be kept on file by the preschool.

Registration & Fees: Return completed registration form with \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee within two weeks to ensure a position in our program. Tuition, in the amount of \$145, will be due the 1st of each month. A one-time supply fee of \$75 will be due by orientation, which will be held the last week of August. 
