

#### GIVING THANKS TO GOD

One: Gracious God, our Creator, we give you thanks...

All: For the wonder and goodness of Creation, for so bountifully providing for our needs, and in your abounding mercy, for seeking to restore us in our brokenness to your wonderful image.

One: Loving Jesus, our Redeemer, we give you thanks...

All: For your servant's life of preaching, teaching and healing and for your atoning sacrifice on the Cross which has both restored our relationship with our Creator and broken the power of sin to control our lives.

One: Holy Spirit, who sustains us moment by moment, we give you thanks...

All: For your transforming presence which creates unity from our diversity and makes us one with the living God who we worship in Jesus Christ. Prepare us to be faithful disciples, modeling the love, humility, and obedience of Jesus and concern for justice in a world full of need.

#### \*BENEDICTION

Go out into the world with true humility as we continue our journey through: this evening tide, Good Friday and the Saturday Vigil.

**Maundy Thursday** observes the Last Supper (a Passover meal) that Jesus shared with his disciples the night before he was crucified. Before the Passover meal, Jesus washed the feet of his disciples. Thus many churches celebrate the Lord's Supper (Holy Communion) as well as Foot Washing Ceremonies on this day.

**Maundy Thursday** (also known as Holy Thursday, Great Thursday, Covenant Thursday, Sheer Thursday and Thursday of Mysteries) derives its name from the Latin word mandatum, meaning "commandment." [note: John 13:34]
