

BIBLE READING 1 John 17:1-12a Jesus Prays for Us



John 17:1-12a

¹Jesus said these things. Then, raising his eyes in prayer, he said: Father, it's time. Display the bright splendor of your Son so the Son in turn may show your bright splendor. ²You put him in charge of everything human So he might give real and eternal life to all in his charge. ³And this is the real and eternal life: That they know you, The one and only true God, And Jesus Christ, whom you sent.

⁴I glorified you on earth By completing down to the last detail What you assigned me to do. ⁵And now, Father, glorify me with your very own splendor, The very splendor I had in your presence Before there was a world.

⁶I spelled out your character in detail To the men and women you gave me. They were yours in the first place; Then you gave them to me, And they have now done what you said. ⁷They know now, beyond the shadow of a doubt, That everything you gave me is firsthand from you, ⁸For the message you gave me, I gave them; And they took it, and were convinced That I came from you. They believed that you sent me.

⁹I pray for them. I'm not praying for the God-rejecting world But for those you gave me, For they are yours by right. ¹⁰Everything mine is yours, and yours mine,

And my life is on display in them. ¹¹For I'm no longer going to be visible in the world; They'll continue in the world While I return to you. Holy Father, guard them as they pursue this life That you conferred as a gift through me, So they can be one heart and mind ¹²As we are one heart and mind.

WE RESPOND TO GOD'S WORD

*HYMN #706 I Come with Joy (Verses 1-3)

¹⁴I gave them your word; The godless world hated them because of it, Because they didn't join the world's ways, ¹⁵Just as I didn't join the world's ways. I'm not asking that you take them out of the world But that you guard them from the Evil One. ¹⁶They are no more defined by the world Than I am defined by the world.
