

or the past few years, I've been the coordinator for the Presbytery's "Small Church Intern" program; each year, as seminary students undergo their church internship, some few of them choose to explore life in the small church. My role to is meet with them regularly, offering feedback, insight, and directing them in the ways to get the most out of their experience.

This past year, there was only one student intern for me to work with. As I asked him at the beginning of the year why he chose to do an internship with a small church (instead of one of the bigger churches in Richmond), he said he was interested in an experience he hadn't yet had; he grew up in a larger church and wanted to see a smaller one on a short-term basis. He quickly followed that up by saying, "But I feel that, when I graduate and go into ministry, I'll be an associate minister at a bigger church."

When I asked him, a few weeks ago at the end of the internship, how he had grown and what he had learned, he surprised me by saying that he now felt he would be a solo pastor at a small church somewhere. When I asked how the internship contributed to that change of perspective, his response was simply, "I don't know...but there's something mighty about the small church and its ministry."

I couldn't agree more, and I would be hard-pressed to state it as well: There's something at work in the mighty small church. And that's what we are: a mighty small church. Now, some could look at "mighty small" and think that I'm emphasizing the degree of smallness (as in: "Wow, you're not just small, but you're mighty small!"), but those that would think that way are missing

the true gift being presented before them. We, along with many other churches our size, are MIGHTY small...as in, our truest gift and strength, our *might*, is found in the very fact that we are small, as opposed to larger.

I know it may not always feel like that's much of a gift or a strength, particularly when we're looking out over the pews on a low-attendance Sunday morning, or looking at the checking account balance for the end of the month. There are times and aspects when being small certainly doesn't feel mighty. But that's only true when we look at the church, our church, and measure it through the eyes and criteria of this world. And, brothers and sisters, hear me well as I say this: *This is not the way our church is valued, or truly measured.*

I had the epiphany earlier this month, and I continue to joyfully live with its revelation: the greatest earthly gift the church can offer is the embodiment of divine relationship, unlabeled by human terms, among its members as well as the community in which it resides. In short, our strength lies in the very fact that we, as a smaller, family-oriented church, can offer that familial community to each other and everyone else throughout Prince George. We can offer a familial community that does not focus primarily on age or gender or status or anything else earthly, but simply loves as family does. This is our greatest gift, our greatest strength, and we live into it quite well. We are a mighty small church, indeed.

Registration for the 2018-2019 School Year will begin March 1, 2018. Please contact Janet Lammey, Preschool Director, via phone 804-203-3061 or email gregorymemorialps@hotmail.com to check availability of openings for enrollment.

Eligibility: Children must be 3 years of age by <u>September 30</u> of the current school year. A copy of each child's birth certificate from their state of birth, as well as a copy of the child's immunization record is requested at registration and will be kept on file by the preschool.

Registration & Fees: Return completed registration form with \$50.00 non-refundable registration fee within two weeks to ensure a position in our program. Tuition, in the amount of \$145, will be due the 1st of each month. A one-time supply fee of \$75 will be due by orientation, which will be held the last week of August.
