### Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



We declare to you what we have seen and heard so that you also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. We are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. -1 John 1:3-4

t may have caught your attention that I've been a bit nostalgic, recently, and for a reason that's pretty understandable. Not nostalgic for "the good ol' days," necessarily; I'm well aware that humans have a tendency to view their past with the good aspects front and center. Rather, I've been nostalgic for the family that I was raised around, the people who helped shape me during my formative years into who I am today, who did their best to make sure that I had as many good aspects of life as possible on which to look back upon, the people who showed me love and nurture and taught me the best they were able how to look for and live into love, as well. I've been nostalgic for these people, who are no longer living on this earth, because I would love for them to see where I am now, who I'm with, what I'm doing, and especially to be introduced to the child that furthers their family name.

I lament that they will never know our child in person, but perhaps more so that our child will never have the same benefits I had of learning directly from the lives and lessons its ancestors. I grew up with stories of family members who I never had the privilege of meeting first-hand; and while I know that that is a reality of our world, it is still a lament that I carry with me.

Yet, I know that our child will get to know these family members. Through us, through our stories, and through the ways in which we have been shaped by them and their influence is upon our lives, Megan and I will be able to share with our child the ones who came before her, who came before us. Because we don't exist in isolation; we are tied to the community of our family and we bear in us the reflection of all those family members, past and present. They have taught and strengthened us, and so we will do the same. I'm notoriously bad at asking for help; I could try to pin that on any number of reasons, but the simple truth is that I try to do too much and too rarely ask for help or assistance. But I know that I did not come to this point in life without the help, strength, support, and teaching of many others in my life (and even before my life). And so, I know that I will likely need help as we face this new reality, and that I'm not sure I'll know how to ask for it. But I do know this: I can rest assured in the community of not just family, but of faith, as well. This community, in which we live and dwell and have our being, will be there for us just as it has been present for so many others over the decades. Such a truth is a great reassurance!

For truly, this is who we are to one another: family, bonded together by more than just DNA but by the Spirit of God dwelling within each of us, bringing us together in worship, fellowship, and service. What a marvelous and wonderful gift we are to one another, a gift made possible through the love of Christ to this world! We are a support, a benevolence, and a joy, in tough times and in easy, and in that the fellowship of Christ is realized and made known.

Not only that, it is shared with all the saints who have come before us in the faith. One of my favorite hymns is, "For All the Saints." We tend to sing it primarily at funerals, but what a wondrous reminder of those who have shared their lives and love with us and others! As we move into this month during which we remember the saints of our lives, may we indeed be continually blessed by their memory and the fellowship they shared with us.


## WHAT'S JASON READING?
