

Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,

iving in New York, I often found that February was the longest month. The winter cold and snow had begun to feel as if it was dragging on too long, and each new snowstorm brought with it an increased sense of vindictiveness, as if the weather was taunting us into thinking we'd never see spring again, and might never be warm again. I've found that I can cope with the cold up to mid-February, and then I'm ready for a change of pace.

Thinking on that now, as February winds down and March is set to come in (either like a lion or a lamb, I can never remember which), I realize that this has to do with a sense of anticipation: both hoped for and lived out. At the time, I'd be anticipating the arrival of spring, hoping for it with each new day, and living out the reality that it hasn't happened yet.

I find that I'm still anticipating, even here and now. For instance: it is now official, I will graduate from Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary as a Doctor of Ministry on May 19! I'm anticipating this event, but I know that it is yet to come. I'm also anticipating, to varying degrees: opening day of baseball season, the day that we baptize Carrie with her family gathered around her (April 21), becoming certified in Critical Incident Stress Management (no, I'm not going back to school again, no worries there!), and yes, I'm still anticipating spring (it is still February as I write this).

But I am finding, as we approach the beginning of the season of Lent, that there are other things I anticipate, as well, things that might easily be looked over, but which are perhaps a bit more profound. I anticipate seeing each of you in worship on Sunday mornings, gathering in sacred space to share a unique and meaningful aspect of our lives with one another. I anticipate journeying with you through the spiritual wilderness of Lent as we make our way to Jerusalem, following our Lord in his Passion, watching with him in the Garden, witnessing to his crucifixion and then, in fullest joy, hearing the women again proclaim his resurrection! Christmas is joyful, but Lent and Easter are my favorite seasons of the Church year!

And I realize that there are truths that can hinder our anticipation, or the realization of what we hope for. Weather, health issues, schedules can all keep us from worship on Sunday mornings, and then not only is my anticipation unrealized but our community is lessened, as well. Emergencies and other demands on our time, unexpected events can all get in the way of the realization of what we anticipate. But I've come to realize two truths about anticipation, as well:

- 1) There will always be hindrances that get in the way of the things anticipate seeing or doing. Rather than let myself be defined by these hiccups, I can instead focus on what it is about this anticipation that brings me joy, and look for that in other ways (for example: I anticipate the first game of opening season, but if I can't tune into that, if I miss it...well, I can take joy in knowing that it has arrived, and try to get the next game).
- 2) Anticipation of an event is not a passive state, it is active. I must put what work I can into helping this anticipation be achieved. On the other side of this coin, especially when it involves other people, I need to remember that I can do all I can, and then have to let others make their choices (for example: I can't force anyone to come to church, but I can encourage and invite and then let them make their own decision).

Friends, we are about to enter one of the greatest spiritual seasons of anticipation. How will you approach it? What work will you do along the way? How will you challenge yourself to join in our community during this season, that our anticipation of the "not yet realized" will be fulfilled in right time, and all our joy will be made complete? We'll kick off Lent with events on March 5 and March 6, so check the church calendar for more information. I anticipate with joy your presence with us!




