ne of the movies I resonated with the most during my formative years of middle and high school was *Glory*, the dramatization of the story of the first African-American regiment during the Civil War, the 54th Massachusetts Infantry. Led by Col. Robert Gould Shaw (depicted by a much younger Matthew Broderick), the movie follows the regiment from its formation to its culminating role in the assault on Fort Wagner, South Carolina. Prior to this assault, as the soldiers stood at the ready, these above words were asked, so that if one should fall, the standard and the cause would continue. It's a somewhat minor moment, but has deep ramifications.

In our lives of faith, we are committed to service: serving our Lord, who makes life and faith possible in the first place; serving God, who has created us in relationship with God and all aspects of creation; serving each other and our communities, that the Light of Christ might show through us and all would be strengthened. Service in the name of Christ is a foundational aspect of our lives of faith, so much so that it is incorporated into the vows of ordination within our Church – whether ruling elder or teaching elder, one of the questions asked encourages the active participation in the councils of the Church, sharing in the work of government and discipline. [PC(U.S.A.) *Book of Order*, W-4.4003i].

Despite this, it seems that the idea of service becomes a threat more than an invitation. I have actively heard the comment that someone would rather avoid becoming a church member than feel the call of serving the church; that an elder would rather avoid participating in presbytery or synod because it would just lead to more commitments. Time is a scare resource, energy is a fading commodity, and the fear of not knowing what to do undergirds it all.

This misconception about service – to the church and to each other, to our God and in the name of our Lord − is slowly choking the church and hindering its growth. And while I am certainly not going to sit here and attempt to guilt anyone into service (reluctant servers can just as easily do more harm than good), I would like to offer a counter-point: In all my years of service, in all the capacities I have engaged, I have never had an occasion where my awareness of spirituality and depth of communion with Christ and his body have not been deepened in a life-affirming way. I have never walked away from an occasion of service and thought, 'I can't believe I did all that and got nothing out of it.' In truth, I have always received a deeper sense of connection to my brothers and sisters in faith along with a renewed appreciation for the Church. Why, then, wouldn't I want to serve?

"If this man should fall, who will then take up the standard?" While service in the church may not be as risky as charging a fort, the question convicts me all the same: In what ways am I able to serve, and allow Christ to use me and the gifts I have been given? In what ways are you? And remember, Christ himself proclaims that his burden is light and his yoke is easy; when we serve in His name, the rewards are joyfully unimaginable.


