

he chair I was sitting in was fairly uncomfortable, as I sat in my office/study last Sunday while the motion to renew and reaffirm the Pastoral Covenant was being discussed in my absence. That's a bit of an understatement: the chair is decidedly uncomfortable. If you haven't poked your head in to see it, or need a reminder, I have in my office an antique church chair, which sat in the pulpit area of The Franklinville Presbyterian Church. When Franklinville closed, the chair came to me, and I placed it here to serve as a reminder of many things. One thing I don't remember, though, is how uncomfortable it truly is to sit in; one of the back supports runs directly up your spine if you lean back against it, making any sense of peace nearly nonexistent. I was sitting in it, though, because I wanted to sit with a different perspective for the time being.

And while I sat there, my eyes fell easily on two things: the window that shows the trees behind the back of the church, and the picture on the bulletin board of me and the pastoral search committee from February 2013, on the day that I had been interviewed by the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry, the day on which the call we had been dreaming of together was approved and it was certain we would be moving forward together. Sitting there that afternoon, with a wooden rod along my spine, I thought back to that day and the joyous excitement we all had as we looked forward with GMPC, and out the window and the cold sunshine reminding me of life moving along – birds in the trees and air, squirrels in the branches, people living their lives.

While I had very little doubt that the call and pastoral covenant would be approved, there is a certain amount of anxiety that goes along with stepping out and allowing space for conversation while I awaited a vote that would intimately affect the coming year of my life, of our family's life. I guess no matter how certain one might be, there's always a bit of 'holding one's breath' while waiting to see if everything is approved. I thought, in those minutes, of the time that had spanned from the

taking of that picture in 2013 to now, almost exactly seven years later; I thought of the hours we had spent together in worship, the sermons preached, the joys of baptisms and weddings celebrated, the lives remembered and honored with tears and laughter alike. I thought of the deep and abiding presence of God at our Lord's Table, of bearing witness to the Resurrection and receiving the Good News of Immanuel, of hymns and anthems sung, candles lit, prayers offered. I thought of meetings attended and discussions held, meals prepared and cleaned up, water damage and repair. I thought back on all these things, and I thanked God for the blessing and privilege it has been to be present through it all, and asked that the blessing and privilege would continue. With joyous gratitude to God and to each and every one of you, it will, and I offer both my thanks and my commitment.

It is not a comfortable chair that I was sitting in, but I knew that to be the case and I wanted to sit there, anyway. I didn't want to be comfortable, or in a familiar position of ministry at my desk or reading; I wanted a renewed perspective, one that would remind me not to get comfortable or complacent, one that would remind me that ministry is not about sitting still all the time or always being in peaceful situations. I wanted to remember that sometimes the road of ministry is hard and carries sorrow with it, as well as the promise of looking forward, focusing not on what once was but upon the life that is present before us. This chair offered all of that, and it was a blessing in and of itself. May we all be so blessed in the days and months to come, and may we live into God's rich blessing as we live out the Kingdom of our Lord here in Prince George.


