Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,



Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ~ 2 Corinthians 5:17

See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

~ Isaiah 43:19

The as-yet-unnamed Lemhi Pass was before them. After long months of travel and exploration, Lewis and Clark's Corps of Discovery faced an unexpected challenge, one they had not anticipated nor prepared for: the waterways they had been following, attempting to chart a water course from the Atlantic to the Pacific, had come to an end and what was before them now was not the Western coast, but rather the imposing spires of the Rocky Mountains. It was a defining moment, and a critical choice needed to be made: would they give up and return home, proclaiming that a water course did not exist? Or would they continue forward, not as river guides but as explorers in unknown land, changing and adapting to achieve a newly reformed goal?

We know what they chose, and we can be grateful for their spirit of exploration and discovery, their willingness to embrace the unknown and uncomfortable to achieve a greater goal, to adapt and change their skill sets and practices in order to find a way to the Pacific Coast. And in the life of the Church, we, too, are facing our own version of the Lemhi Pass; we, too, are facing such a choice as to how we go forward, and in what manner.

Certainly, with a pandemic facing the country and the world right now, we are standing on the precipice of our 'Lemhi Pass' and surveying the landscape in front of us, wondering what we are to do, how we are to proceed, and what impact all of this has on our ultimate goal. In the metaphor of being a guide, seminary certainly never prepared me for this kind of situation! While we face this unknown expedition in this immediate sense, those who have been scanning the horizon of how the Church lives out its calling in the world have seen signs of this moment coming, as well. In more ways than one, the church (particular to its local community) and the Church (the global community of Christ) has been coming to this Pass for some time, and many have wondered what will be on

the other side of it. How will the Church look and operate? What will be different? What will be the same? What will be left behind in order to move forward in ever more faithful ways? And if there's any silver-lining of a world disrupted from its daily status quo, it is the opportunity to be adventurous in how we live out and proclaim our faith; we are all placed into a state where we must experiment and adapt, as well as determine what is at our nonnegotiable core vs. what can be changed or even left where it is.

It is still not easy. Such change and adaptation never is; in fact, it is quite difficult and can even be quite painful. But we now find ourselves, forced in some cases, to ask, "How do we most faithfully live into who we are called to be, proclaiming the Good News we have received, in this evolving and changing landscape?" Truly, that is the only question that matters at this moment.

Lewis and Clark, reaching the end of their map, gave up who they thought they were as river guides and took on a whole new identity of mountain explorers as they continued on in their overarching mission. The way they kept to their mission changed, but not the mission itself, nor their commitment to it. The same opportunity is before us as the Church, and as GMPC, today; when all of this has cleared up, it will not be enough to simply return to how we've always done things. Rather, we will be in a position to bring back some of what we have missed while at the same time incorporating what we've adapted. Let us be faithful explorers together in this new landscape!

Due to the precautionary efforts brought about by the COVIC-19 pandemic, including suspension of worship services and other gatherings in the interim and "social distancing", the Easter Lilies will not be ordered for this Easter's services. Be assured that refunds will be issued.
