Dear Saints and Friends of Gregory Memorial,

We are reminded that, out of a fullness of love which is sometimes incomprehensible, God chose to reach out to humanity, to creation, to us in such a way that there would truly no longer be any hindrance or barrier between us (us and each other, or us and God). And as this year approaches its close, even on a day of Christmas celebration, we are aware of how restless our spirits have been.

Certainly the world as we know it has generated restlessness in these past 12 months (the last 10, in particular). And we have sought to ease our restless spirits in any number of ways accessible to us. But the truth of the matter is this: we will always be restless, and we shall not find our rest until we find it in the Divine Presence. And we can thank God that God chose to come and meet us where we are in life, bringing to us even a measure of this otherwise unattainable peace.

I know that I am still new to this whole parenting gig (even as I write this, it was not a very peaceful morning with our Beloved Toddler), but I appreciate and realize how — even in the space of a lack of rest or looking around at the chaos of the house — even a brief moment of unexpected love from her can balance out all the rest. I remember, in those early weeks, the stress of keeping her comfortable and fed when awake, and then the bliss of holding her and watching her while she slept, and I knew peace in a way that was previously unknown to me.

And it is this peace, this comfort, this moment of being filled-full that we realize as we celebrate the birth of Jesus, and read again of his coming into the world, being laid in a manger, watched over by parents, shepherds, sheep, and heavenly host alike. In this moment, in this day of celebration (and the 12 other days of the Christmas season!), we recognize that the gift we receive is the realization, even in part, of the One in whom we find our rest, our peace, our fulfillment. This is the first of many gifts that come from this incarnation, and may we indeed celebrate it today, tomorrow, and into the New Year!

- On-line worship offerings will continue via Zoom (Meeting ID: 756-330-772, Passcode 6300) and Facebook Live From the church's Facebook page; or those without reliable internet may dial 1-253-215-8782 and enter Meeting ID# 756-330-772, Passcode 6300.
- ~ If you are experiencing fever or other symptoms/illness, please stay home and worship with us virtually.
- ~ If you feel comfortable doing so, you may join us in person with the following considerations:
 - Cloth masks are still in effect for public spaces. If you plan to join us in person, please join us as well in wearing a mask for the health of us all.
 - Please make liberal use of the hand sanitizer placed at each entrance to the Sanctuary.
 - Family units are asked to keep physical distance of 6 feet. Pews are marked off for this.
 - Worship information will be available on the weekly "bulletin" handout. This will also be available digitally on the church website for those who wish to worship from home.

Above all and through all, remember this: Jesus loves you and loves us; we are not abandoned; this will last some time, but is still temporary in the grand scheme of life; the more we do our part the quicker we will be on the other side of it.

Missions: Have you ever wondered where your 5-Cents-A-Meal money went? In August, the Missions Committee sent \$500 to Social Services with specific instructions that the money be spent on food for any family here in Prince George that was struggling during the Pandemic. We trust that people in our community benefitted from this gift.

In October, Missions met and decided on several projects that would not only help our community but spread the love of God. It was decided that our local Police Department could use a reminder that the citizens support them and that God's love is with them at all times.
