in not one to offer spoilers on movies, but as this one came out back in 1989 I figure if you're going to see it, you will have by now. Toward the end of *When Harry Met Sally*, Harry (played by Billy Crystal) is explaining to Sally (Meg Ryan) why he ran to where she was at a New Year's Eve party. He explains that it has nothing to do with it being New Year's Eve, or any other act of desperation or loneliness, but that he had sprinted to her because, "When you realize you want to spend the rest of your life with somebody, you want the rest of your life to start as soon as possible!"

After all the other things in life that had taken his attention and distracted him – work, hobbies, other relationships, etc. – Harry realizes the one thing, the one person who is most important, and he wants the rest of his life with her to start in that moment.

Similarly, in *The Greatest Showman* (the 2017 fictionalized story of P.T. Barnum, played by Hugh Jackman), Barnum realizes that all he's been chasing and achieving has been a distraction from what he's truly desired: his family. In the musical rendition, he proclaims, "From now on, what's waited 'til tomorrow starts tonight! Let this promise in me start, like an anthem in my heart, from now on!"

We in the church recently celebrated Pentecost, the almost violent in-breaking of the Spirit of God in the lives and hearts of the disciples (now apostles). It was a moment in which everything changed, and would not be the same again. It was the moment in which the apostles realized their desire, not as something made complete, but as something begun and continuing "from now on."

We so often think of Pentecost as that great event that happened generations and years ago, in another time and place far removed from us. Historically, this may be true, but Pentecost is an on-going reality, something begun and something presently happening. Today is Pentecost, as you read this. Tomorrow is Pentecost, regardless of what your day may hold. Because Pentecost is the beginning of the fullest realization of the Kingdom of God, a Kingdom which has been glimpsed and proclaimed by generations of faithful throughout time – from the apostles to the Revelation of John to the early church leaders all the way to us. We see and live into the Kingdom; it starts afresh with us, it starts now, and continues from now on.

We still yearn for and desire to see the Kingdom of God fully realized and made known, and those days are surely coming, says the Lord. And even in the "not yet," we celebrate the "now," recognizing that what we so often long for has indeed already begun, and we are living it out. What a joyous, Pentecost day today is, after all!

GREETINGS SAINTS AND FRIENDS OF GREGORY MEMORIAL!

Your Session has been diligent in faithfully assessing how we continue to worship and move forward, and now especially, in light of the updated guidelines and proclamations from both CDC and local and federal leaders. Please note the following:

IF YOU ARE FULLY VACCINATED,

- You no longer need to wear a mask when entering/exiting, or moving about the Sanctuary. Of course, if it is your personal comfort level to do so, then please be happy in doing so.
- <u>We will no longer physically block off every other pew.</u> We encourage you to sit where you are comfortable sitting, and with whom, but please be respectful of others as we make this transition --- there may be some who are still more comfortable sitting with a bit of distance, and that's ok.
- <u>At this time, we will still refrain from singing hymns together</u>, though Session is discussing this aspect in an ongoing conversation. We will also be exploring other musical options in the meantime. I know this is disappointing to many of us, but please continue in grace and understanding. Thank you.

Heard It All Now ...

The Montana State Department of Fish and Wildlife ("They") is advising golfers to take extra precautions, and be on the alert for bears while playing on Gallatin, Helena, and Lewis and Clark National Forest's golf courses.

They advise golfers to wear noise-producing devices such as *little bells on their clothing* to alert, but not to startle the bears unexpectedly.

They also advise golfers to carry *pepper spray in the case of an encounter with a bear.*

They say that it's also a good idea to watch for signs of bear activity on the courses, and they even recommend that golfers learn to recognize the difference between Black Bear and Grizzly Bear droppings: Black Bear droppings are smaller and contain remains of nuts, berries and possibly squirrel, rabbit or gopher fur, while Grizzly Bear droppings contain *small bells, golf* gloves, sunglasses and other similar golf items, and usually smell like
