

THE HISTORY OF GREGORY'S ANGEL TREE

he original Angel Tree was a program begun by the Salvation Army in 1979. Majors Charles and Shirley White, working with a Lynchburg, Virginia shopping mall, used it as a way to provide clothing and toys for children at Christmastime.



They identified the wishes of local children by writing their needs on Hallmark greeting cards that featured pictures of angels. The cards were placed on a Christmas tree at the mall to allow shoppers to select children to help. More than 700 children had a brighter Christmas that first year.

The tradition spread across the country "like wildfire", thanks to WSM radio in Nashville, Tennessee, and CNN, which aired nationally.

After seeing the Angel Tree displayed at South Park Mall many years ago, I purchased one of the gifts off the tree and really had a warm, fuzzy feeling as a result. I was stepping outside of the family to do something for a stranger that I had never met. *It just felt right!!!*



Some years later, I became the chairperson of the Missions Committee here at Gregory. I was inspired to use the Angel Tree concept as our Christmas project. We adopted a family from the Department of Social Services that year. Since that time we have continued to help bring gifts of clothing, toys,

food and household items to various organizations.

Most recently we have been supporting the students at the Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands. Located in Wytheville, Virginia and supported by the Presbytery of the James, it has been serving orphaned children of all ages for just over 100 years. Again this year, we will adorn Gregory's Angel Tree with the needs of Presbyterian Children's Home of the Highlands!!

Your Session has been diligent in faithfully assessing how we continue to worship and move forward, and now especially, in light of the updated guidelines and proclamations from both CDC and local and federal leaders. Please note the following:

IF YOU ARE FULLY VACCINATED,
