ONE CENT: JUST ONE PENNY – OR IS IT MORE?

Have you ever looked down wherever you were and found a penny?

The story goes that a husband and wife were invited to spend the weekend at the husband's employer's home. The wife was nervous about the weekend. The boss was very wealthy, with a fine home on the waterway, and cars costing more than her house.

The first day and evening went well, and she was delighted to have this rare glimpse into how the very wealthy live. The husband's employer was quite generous as a host, and took them to the finest restaurants. The wife knew she would never have the opportunity to indulge in this kind of extravagance again, so was enjoying herself immensely.

As the three of them were about to enter an exclusive restaurant that evening, the boss was walking slightly ahead of them. He stopped suddenly, looking down on the pavement for a long, silent moment.

The wife wondered if she was supposed to pass him. There was nothing on the ground except a single darkened penny that someone had dropped, and a few cigarette butts.

Still silent, the man reached down and picked up the penny. He held it up and smiled, then put it in his pocket as if he had found a great treasure. How absurd! What need did this man have for a single penny? Why would he even take the time to stop and pick it up?

Throughout dinner, the entire scene nagged at her. Finally, she could stand it no longer. She casually mentioned that her daughter once had a coin collection, and asked if the penny he had found had been of some value.

A smile crept across the man's face as he reached into his pocket for the penny and held it out for her to see. She had seen many pennies before! What was the point of this?

"Look at it." He said. "Read what it says."

She read aloud the words "United States of America."

"No, not that; read further!" he directed.

"One cent?" she asked.

"No, keep reading."

She squinted at the print and in a puzzled tone, she asked, "In God we Trust?"

"Yes!" he exclaimed, returning the penny to his pocket.

"And your point is...?" she asked with a hint of irritation at the importance focused on the small coin.

He smiled broadly and explained, "And if I trust in God, the name of God is holy, even on a coin. Whenever I find a coin, I see that inscription. It's stamped on every single U. S. coin, but we never seem to notice it! God drops a message right in front of me telling me to trust Him! Who am I to pass it by? When I see a coin, I pray. I stop to see if my trust IS in God at that moment. I pick the coin up as a response to God: that I DO trust in Him. For a short time, at least, I cherish it as if it were gold. I think it's God's way of starting a conversation with me. Lucky for me, God is patient and pennies are plentiful!"

This man knew the power of simple, daily Christian object lessons! We always hear stories of pennies on the sidewalk being good luck, etc. This story gives it a twist that turns our thoughts immediately toward God!

Just like in Jesus day we have to pay taxes to the government, but only does God deserve our trust and devotion.

Let's let a penny remind us just like the man in the story to stop and thank God for all His blessings and also to make sure we are trusting Him in our lives at that very moment.

Also, the next time you use the phrase "a penny for your thoughts," be reminded that even something as small as a penny can bring your thoughts back to God!


