WALKING BY FAITH, NOT BY SIGHT

Remember that scene from *Indiana Jones: The Last Crusade*, when Indy's Holy Grail quest takes on a serious tone as his quest to find the Grail promises hope of saving the life of his gravely-wounded father by passing 3 tests? The 3rd test is the hardest: To reach the chamber that holds the Grail, Indy must cross a 30-foot cavern with no obvious way to get to the other side. Although he is the great Indiana Jones, this feat seems impossible. Following the instructions from his father's diary, he must take a "step of faith" where there is no visible bridge, stepping into a void. As Indy speaks the words, "Leap of faith...", he plants his foot tentatively forward into space and miraculously it lands on solid ground, proving that a bridge *DID* exist, albeit invisible to him, after all: "LEAP OF FAITH."

No surprise then, that the concept of "walking by faith, not by sight" means living according to God's promises and guidance, trusting in the unseen rather than what's seen or understood through human senses. This principle, found in 2 Corinthians 5:7 ["...for we walk by faith, not by sight...", HOLY BIBLE, NRSV], encourages believers to have a spiritual perspective and trust in God's plan even when they don't fully comprehend it.

Key aspects of walking by faith:

- Trusting in God's promises. This involves believing in God's character, His love, and His ability to fulfill His word.
- Relying on the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit guides believers and aligns with God's word, leading them towards wisdom and practicality.
- Embracing the eternal perspective. Recognizing that this earthly life is temporary and that there is more to life than what can be seen, including eternal rewards with Christ.

 Making decisions based on faith. Choosing to trust in God's guidance, even when it may seem illogical or challenging, rather than relying on immediate circumstances or human understanding.

> Examples of walking by faith:

- Responding to challenges with courage. Trusting that God is working all things together for good, even in difficult situations, and approaching challenges with hope and confidence.
- Making decisions based on God's will. Seeking God's guidance through prayer and scripture, and making choices that align with His word, even if they seem unconventional.
- **Living with a focus on the unseen.** Recognizing that the physical world is temporary and focusing on spiritual growth and serving others.

> Important considerations:

- Walking by faith is not reckless or irresponsible. It
 doesn't mean abandoning planning, prayer, or seeking
 God's direction. It's about aligning actions with faith
 and seeking God's will.
- Faith involves trusting in God's timing. It's important
 to understand that God's timing may differ from our
 own, and we should trust in His plan, even when
 things don't happen as we expect.
- It's important to remember: Faith is a journey. It's a process of learning to trust God more deeply and relying on Him in every aspect of life.


