

Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Lord, listen to your children praying.

One: We pray too, O Lord, for those who come fresh to our minds and hearts Today: perhaps a family member we have prayed for over many weeks or years, or a friend struggling to find meaning in his life, an acquaintance who needs healing, a stranger who needs the comfort of your Spirit as they grieve. Lord, hear your people as they pray and name those names and concerns before you. [Pause in silence] Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Lord, listen to your children praying.

One: Thank you, Lord, for being our God and making us your people. Thank you for growing in us and helping us to grow. Thank you for the ministry you entrust to us. May your will be done in us and by us, both now and forevermore. This we ask in the name of your Son, who taught us to pray, saying, "Our Father..."
